LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

Department of Commerce,

Bureau of the Census,

Washington, D. C., August 14, 1931.

SIR:

I transmit herewith Volume I of the Reports on Agriculture, Fifteenth Decennial Census, which contains statistics, by minor civil divisions, on the number of farms; farm acreage, classified according to character and use; value of farm land and buildings; value of farm buildings; value of farmers' dwellings; and value of farm implements and machinery.

The census of agriculture was taken in conformity with "The Act providing for the Fifteenth Census and for the Apportionment of Representatives in Congress," approved June 18, 1929. The results of the census of agriculture, 1930, are contained in five volumes: Volume I, the report on farm acreage and farm values, by townships or other minor civil divisions; Volume II (Parts 1, 2, and 3), reports for States, with statistics for counties, relating to agriculture, exclusive of irrigation and drainage; Volume III (Parts 1, 2, and 3), reports by States with statistics for counties, by type of farm; Volume IV, special reports; Volume V, general report and analytical tables; and the reports on irrigation and drainage, each in one volume.

The collection and compilation of these statistics and the preparation of this volume were under the supervision of William Lane Austin, chief statistician for agriculture. He was assisted by Morris J. Hole, assistant chief statistician, Sherman S. Slick, Margaret A. Patch, Z. R. Pettet, W. B. Jenkins, R. D. Jennings, and H. M. Taylor. The cards were punched under the supervision of George B. Wetzel and the machine tabulation was under the supervision of W. B. Cragg.

Acknowledgment is also made of the cooperation of Dr. L. C. Gray and Dr. O. E. Baker of the United States Department of Agriculture.
