CHAPTER IV

STATISTICS BY RACE OF FARM OPERATOR

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Introduction.—This chapter presents, by race of operator, statistics for the number of farm operators (which is identical with the number of farms), acreage in farms, value of farms, and the value of implements and machinery. The value of farms (the value of land and buildings) is separated into the value of all buildings and the value of the land exclusive of buildings.

Totals for the United States are presented for all white operators and for all colored operators. Additional data for all white operators and for all colored operators are given by States in Chapter III. Figures for the country as a whole and by States are presented in the current chapter for Mexicans and Hindus, who are grouped with white operators; and for Negroes, Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and "All other nonwhite races," which comprise the group "Colored farm operators."

Comparable figures for the number of farm operators, where available, are given for decennial years since 1900. Comparable data for farm acreage and for value of farms (land and buildings combined) are available for 1920 only. Separate values for land, buildings, and the value of implements and machinery, by race, are available for the first time in 1930.

In this chapter the data for Negroes are shown under the three available tenure classes, namely, owners, managers, and tenants. Detailed information, by tenure, for all farm operators, for all white farm operators, and for all colored farm operators is shown in Chapter III, which is devoted primarily to that subject.

Number of farm operators, by race: 1900 to 1930.— In 1930, of the 6,288,648 farm operators in the United States, 5,372,578, or 85.4 per cent, were classed as white, and 916,070, or 14.6 per cent, as colored. The group "White farm operators" includes 36,233 Mexicans and 210 Hindus. The group "Colored farm operators" was made up of 882,850 Negroes, 26,817 Indians, 5,840 Japanese, 476 Chinese, 56 Filipinos, 30 Koreans, and 1 Hawaiian.

The percentage of white and colored operators remained practically constant at each census from 1900 to 1930; the proportion of white operators at each decennial period being, 86.6 per cent, 85.5 per cent, 85.3 per cent, and 85.4 per cent, respectively.

Farms operated by Mexicans, 1930.—In 1930, Mexicans formed only 0.6 per cent of all farm operators for the country as a whole, but were of some importance locally in Texas, New Mexico, California, Colorado, Arizona, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Oklahoma.

Farms operated by Hindus, 1930,—Table 4 presents the statistics for the 210 Hindus operating farms on April 1, 1930; California, with 161, had nearly fourfifths of these. Hindus are included with white operators in all agriculture publications. Farms operated by Negroes: 1900 to 1930.—The proportion of all farms operated by Negroes rose from 13 per cent in 1900 to 14 per cent in 1910, to 14.4 per cent in 1920, but receded to 14 per cent in 1930. The decrease during the last decade is largely attributable to declines of 43,389 in Georgia, 31,674 in South Carolina, and 8,092 in Virginia. Partly offsetting these large decreases are increases of 21,577 in Mississippi, 11,698 in Louisiana, 7,343 in Texas, and 7,281 in Arkansas. Outside of the Southern States, the largest increase was 3,020 in Missouri, practically all of which was in the cotton-growing counties.

In 1930, although representing 14 per cent of all farms, the land operated by Negroes formed 3.8 per cent of all farm land, and the value of this land and the buildings thereon was 2.9 per cent of the total value of all farms. From these figures it would appear that the farms operated by Negroes are not so large nor so valuable, either on a per farm or on a per acre basis, as those of all other operators. A better comparison is available, however, when these figures are confined to the Southern States where 98.7 per cent of all the Negro operated farms are located.

Table 3 presents for the United States the data for Negroes, by tenure, and Tables 6 and 7 present the same information by geographic divisions and States. Of the farms operated in 1930 by Negroes, 79.4 per cent were tenant farms with 69.6 per cent of the land and 75.1 per cent of the value.

Farms operated by Indians: 1900 to 1930.—The decrease in the number of farms operated by Indians from 24,251 in 1910 to 16,680 in 1920, and the increase to 26,817 from 1920 to 1930 are due mainly to a change in the method of enumerating the farming operations on Indian reservations. In 1910 and 1930 special efforts were made to obtain a schedule for each individual Indian engaged in agriculture, while in 1920 many reservation groups were enumerated as single farms. The figures, therefore, do not necessarily represent radical changes in the number of Indians actually engaged in farming.

Farms operated by Japanese: 1900 to 1930.—The number of Japanese farm operators declined from 6,892 in 1920 to 5,840 in 1930 after showing relatively large increases from 1900 to 1910 and from 1910 to 1920. Of those reported in 1980, California had 3,956 and most of the others were in Western States.

Farms operated by Chinese: 1900 to 1930.—The number of farms operated by Chinese, 476 in 1930, continued the decline in evidence for each decade since 1900. Most of these were reported in California, with lesser numbers in the other far Western States.

Farms operated by "All other nonwhite races," 1930.—This segregation was made for the first time in 1930, when 56 Filipinos, 30 Koreans, and 1 Hawaiian were reported.
