In table 2 the number of larms reporting any dairy products sold 18 given as $2,630,846$ and 18 based on the number of farms reporting one or more of the following: Gallons of whole milk sold, cream sold in terms of pounds of butterfat, and pounds of butter sold. In table 4 the number of farms reporting dairy products sold or traded is given as 2,847,851 and 18 based on the number of farms reporting dollar sales in response to the ilrst question on income given above. Accordingly, 17,005 more larms, or 0.8 percent, reported income from sales than reported quantities of milk, cream, or butter sold. This difference was goneral, occurring in all geographic
divisions. A part of this difference was concelvably due to some farms having sold milk products, such as cheese, ice cream, skim milk, or buttermilk, for which actual quantity information was not required. offsetting this, to some extent, would be those farms which were unclassifled as to income wich may have had elther or both quantity sales and dollar income from sales of dalry products.
