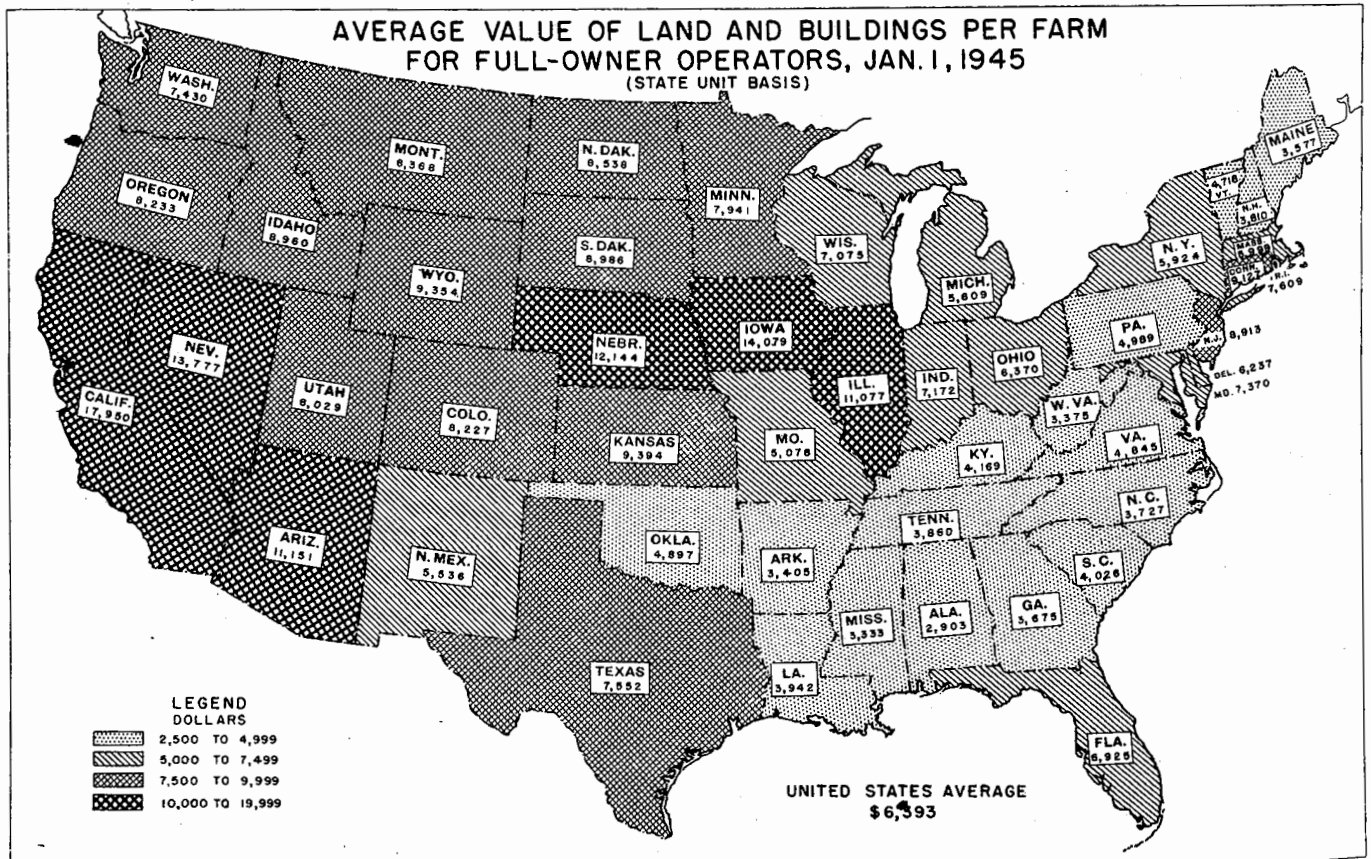


The highest average per-farm values are in the central Corn Belt, near the metropolitan areas of the Middle Atlantic States,

in southern Florida, and the entire area west of the 100th meridian. Low farm values are shown in much of the South.



Farms operated by full owners have a relatively narrow range in value as compared with part-owner- and tenant-operated farms. The value of full-owner farms was generally high in the

North and the West and low in the South and the Northeast. The value of full-owner farms was below that for part-owner farms in all States, but it was above tenant farms in the South.
