Expenditures for machine hire .- Expenditures for machine hire were to include any labor included in the cost of such machine hire. Machine hire refers to custom machine work, such as tractor hire, threshing, combining, silo filling, baling, cotton ginning, plowing, and spraying. If part of the farm product was given as pay for machine hire, the value of the product traded for this service was to be included in the amount of expenditures reported. The cost of trucking, freight, and express was not to be included. The average expenditure per farm reporting machine hire increased from \$222 in 1949 to \$251 in 1954.

Expenditures for hired labor .- In reporting the amount spent for hired labor, only cash payments were to be included. The kinds of perquisites furnished, if any, to supplement the cash wages, were not to be reported. Expenditures for housework and contract construction work were not to be included. If the harvesting of a crop is paid for by someone other than the person in charge-for example, a cooperative or a buyer picking a fruit crop-such expenditures were included as hired labor costs.

An inquiry to obtain the expenditures for farm labor has been included in each Census, except 1935, since 1870. However, no figures on expenditures for farm labor appear in
