

Changes in the Selected Farm Expenditures.—An increasing proportion of the farms is using purchased farm production inputs except hired labor. Most of these inputs come from nonfarm sources.

The number of farms reporting expenditures for farm labor has been declining and there has been a large decrease in the number of farms with expenditures of less than \$1,000 for hired labor. Notwithstanding the decrease in the number of farms, the number of farms reporting an expenditure of \$2,500 or more increased 14.3 percent from 1954 to 1959.
