Major Reporting Items

Land area—The approximate land area refers to all land within a specified geographic area (county, State, etc.) whether used for agricultural purposes or not. The figures used in this chapter differ slightly from those appearing in volume II of the 1964 Census of Agriculture. The differences result from the recalculation of areas, changes in political boundaries, and actual changes in land area resulting from changes in the number and size of reservoirs, lakes, etc. Land area includes dry land and land

temporarily or partially covered by water, such as marshland, swamps, and river flood plains; streams, sloughs, estuaries, and canals less than one-eighth of a mile in width; and lakes, reservoirs, and ponds having less than 40 acres of area.

Land in farms—The land to be included in each farm was determined by inquiries on the report forms and by instructions to farm operators. Farm operators were to report the number of acres owned, then the number of acres rented or worked on shares, then the acres rented or leased to others. The acres owned, plus the acres rented or worked on shares, minus the acres rented or leased to others was designated as "acres in this place" or "acres in this farm." Facsimiles of the sections of the report forms used to determine the acres in each farm and land value are shown below.
