ed. Consequently, less than half of the operators reporting expenditures for contract labor reported the number of contract workers. No estimation of the number of contract workers was made for respondents who did not provide an answer.

Contract labor is utilized most by farms that tend to have less automated harvesting procedures. Table 9 shows that half of all contract labor expenditures are made by vegetable and melon farms (016) and fruit and tree nut farms (017).

Salaried Corporate Officers

The 1974 census data results show over 28,000 corporations. Thirty-four percent of the corporate farms reported salaried officers, slightly over 2 salaried officers per farm with an average salary of \$12,832 (table 10). For corporations with separate farms at multiple locations, entries were reviewed to delete duplicate reporting of corporate officers.

Injuries and Illnesses, and Deaths

Data were not collected on injuries, illnesses, or deaths in any census prior to 1974. Injuries and illnesses to be reported were those which required more than first aid treatment and were work connected. Reports indicating a death or deaths were individually reviewed. Where entries for deaths were obviously in error or where remarks indicated that the death was not work related, the response was deleted. Only a minimum number of cases were verified by recontacting respondents.
