with sales of less than \$2,500. The large decrease in farms since 1969 has significantly affected the number of farms reporting various types of machinery and equipment.

Contributing to the decline in the number of farms reporting machinery and equipment has been the change in the farm definition. The 1969 census included as farms, places of less than 10 acres with sales of \$250 or more, and places of 10 acres or more with sales of \$50 or more. The 1974 farm definition was changed to include as farms, only those

places with sales of \$1,000 or more of agricultural products regardless of the acreage operated. This definitional change resulted in the exclusion of 152,000 places from the 1974 census, of which 138,000 reported value of machinery and equipment totaling more than \$940 million. If these places had been included in the 1974 census data, they would have increased the number of farms reporting and value of machinery and equipment by 6.4 percent and 1.9 percent, respectively. Table 4 contains the number of selected items and the farms reporting that were published under the 1974 definition with comparable data for those places excluded by the change in farm definition between 1969 and 1974. More detailed explanations of the effect of the change in farm definition are included in part 1 of this volume.
