tions such as estates, cooperatives, institutional farms, or Indian reservations. Occasional respondent failure to report operator characteristics was corrected by imputation for age, race, and occupation. No imputation was made for nonreports of residence, year in which operation began, and days worked off farm. Farms reporting these items will, therefore, be fewer than the total number of farms in the census. Tenure is based upon acreage entries in the land ownership section of the report form and applies to all farms.

For the 1969 Census of Agriculture, operator characteristics data were collected for all farms with sales of \$2,500 and over, for all institutional (abnormal) farms regardless of value of sales, and for farms with sales of under \$2,500 which were sampled at a rate of approximately 50 percent. Certain data for 1964 and earlier censuses are based upon tabulations for a sample of approximately 20 percent of all farm operators.

Presentation of Data

Many of the statistics included in this chapter are summaries of data previously published in Volume I, State and County Data, for the individual States. In most cases, they are presented here in different formats and combinations than in volume I.

The tables usually include totals for the United States, 4 regions, 9 divisions, and 50 States. Data are presented for all farms or for farms with sales of \$2,500 and over.

Other Published Data

Most farm operator characteristics data for 1974 are available for each individual State and its counties in volume I. Additional farm operator data by size of farm are included in part 2 of this volume, by tenure in chapter 1 of this part, by value of agricultural products sold in part 7, and by standard industrial classification in part 8. Table 1 summarizes the kind and sources of other published data relating to farm operator characteristics.

For farm operator characteristics data for 1969 and earlier censuses, see the volumes for the respective census years.

Definitions and Explanations

Farm operator—There is one farm operator for each farm with sales of less than \$2,500 and for each farm operated by an individual or a partnership in the 1974 Census of Agriculture. Operator characteristics were not requested for farms operated by corporations and "other" organizations. Characteristics of the farm operator for partnerships, excluding the item on occupation, are for the senior partner involved in the day-to-day operation of the farm. For the 1969 census, the number of farm operators was equal
