

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AUTHORITY, AREA COVERED, AND HISTORY

The 1978 Census of Agricultural Services is the third such census taken for the United States. It was conducted as part of the 1978 Census of Agriculture, in accordance with the provisions of title 13, United States Code. Sections 142(a) and 191 of title 13 provide for a periodic census of agriculture in each State, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Virgin Islands. The census of agricultural services was conducted primarily by mail, and covers each State and the District of Columbia.

AGRICULTURAL SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT

The 1978 Census of Agricultural Services was conducted on an establishment basis, where "establishment" is defined according to the 1972 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual and revised by the 1977 Supplement of the Office of Management and Budget, Executive Office of the President. For purposes of this census, an "agricultural service establishment" is an economic unit primarily engaged in performing for others on a fee or contract basis the following: Soil preparation services, crop services, veterinary services, animal services except veterinary, farm labor and management services, and landscape and horticultural services. In these activities, "primarily engaged" is defined as having received a greater amount of gross receipts for agricultural service activities than for any other SIC major group of activities in which the establishment may be engaged.

Note that agricultural services are often performed as a secondary activity by other establishments. For example, sorting, grading, and packing services are frequently performed by establishments which are primarily engaged in hauling (SIC 42—Motor freight transportation and warehousing), and custom grain grinding is sometimes performed by establishments mainly involved in manufacturing prepared feed (SIC 20—Food and kindred products). Many farm and ranch operators also perform agricultural services for others on a contract or fee basis as a secondary activity. Such secondary activities were excluded from this census.

A business concern or firm engaged in economic activities may consist of more than one establishment depending upon size, location, and relationship of its component activities. The census covers only those establishments primarily engaged in performing agricultural service activities.

SCOPE OF THE CENSUS

The 1978 Census of Agricultural Services was designed to cover the 1978 operations of all agricultural service establishments operating during the year in the United States. The data were collected from establishments primarily engaged in performing agricultural services. For a few cases in which respondents' records were kept on fiscal year basis, data reported for fiscal year 1977-78 were used. Report forms 78-A40A, 78-A40B, 78-A40C, and 78-A40D were used for reporting purposes (see appendix B). The census was conducted on a mailout/mailback basis as in the previous censuses, allowing the respondents to complete the report more nearly at their own convenience as compared to an enumerator-type census. Results from other censuses have shown that, in general, the quality of data on reports completed by respondents exceeds that of reports filled out by enumerators.

COMPARABILITY OF DATA

Comparability of data from the 1978 Census of Agricultural Services with previous census data have been affected by improvements in the coverage of the mail lists, the use of a higher minimum receipts value for inclusion in the tabulations, and modifications in the SIC Manual.

Approximately 352,900 names were included on the 1978 mail list as compared to 142,000 names on the 1974 mail list.

In general, data from the 1978 census are comparable with that of previous censuses. Data obtained for establishments having a dollar volume of business of less than \$2,500 were omitted from the 1978 census. Since there is no satisfactory source list for these small establishments, complete coverage of these establishments was not obtained. Consequently, no attempt was made to include data from these establishments in the final tabulations of the 1978 census. The accuracy of the data collected for small establishments in previous censuses is questionable.

Completion of sections 13, 14, and 15 of the report forms was required only of incorporated establishments and those reporting more than \$50,000 in total volume of business in 1978. It was discovered during the last census that the larger establishments were more able to provide this information with a minimum of difficulty.

Changes in the structure of the SIC system as a result of the 1977 Supplement to the 1972 SIC Manual also affect the comparability of data from the 1978 census with previous censuses. For example, in 1974, grist mill operators and establishments engaged primarily in hay or alfalfa cubing and custom flour, feed, or grain milling were classified as agricultural service establishments. However, in 1978, these establishments were deleted from the major group 07 and, therefore, were excluded from

the census. In view of the addition of irrigation system operation services to the major group 07, data for this agricultural service activity are available for the 1978 census.

RELIABILITY OF DATA

All phases of the census processing were planned to ensure reliable census data. The completed forms were clerically reviewed, keyed to magnetic tape, and then checked by computer for internal consistency. Significant omissions and inconsistencies were resolved by contacting the respondent (by telephone or letter) or by comparison with similar reports. Also during the corresponding stage, efforts were made to obtain completed report forms from nonrespondents. During the last census, certain sections (13, 14, and 15) of the report forms were found to be difficult for small and medium-sized establishments to complete. These sections were only required

of corporations and those establishments reporting \$50,000 or more in total gross receipts. Therefore, 1978 data concerning capital expenses, depreciable assets, and expenses for utilities and fuels obtained from these sections cover only those establishments.

SUMMARY

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This section summarizes the statistics from the 1978 Census of Agricultural Services. Data are presented for the number and types of agricultural service establishments in the United States in 1978 and their gross receipts, labor, and annual payroll for agricultural service activities.

NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS

The statistics compiled for this census represent a total of 93,120 agricultural service establishments. The number of establishments in each State is shown in table A.

For this census, agricultural service establishments are categorized into six major industry groups by standard industrial classification for data presentation. The number of establishments in each group is:

Landscape and horticultural services (SIC 078)	. 46,584

These six major industry groups are further broken down into 15 four-digit industry types. Lawn and garden service establishments is the predominant type, accounting for 74 percent of the establishments in the landscape and horticultural service group and 37 percent of all agricultural service establishments in the United States. Next are animal services, except veterinary, for dogs, cats, horses, bees, fish, rabbits, other fur-bearing animals, birds (except poultry), and other pets which make up 85.3 percent of the establishments in the animal

service, except veterinary, group and 15.5 percent of all agricultural service establishments.

Table B shows the three leading States ranked by number of establishments for individual establishment types and the corresponding percentages of each type for the United States.

GROSS RECEIPTS

Gross receipts for agricultural services from all establishments in 1978 totaled about \$7.25 billion or an average of nearly \$78,000 per establishment. The median amount per establishment was approximately \$25,000. The distribution of establishments according to gross receipts size classes for the United States and the individual geographic regions—Northeast, North Central, South, and West—show that the West leads in the concentration of establishments in the "less than \$10,000" class. This region also has the highest concentration in the classes between \$10,000 and \$100,000.

The distribution by State of gross receipts for agricultural services is shown in chart 1. Table C shows the States ranked by gross receipts.

Of the six industry groups of agricultural service establishments, landscape and horticultural services account for 36.4 percent of the gross receipts for agricultural services, crop services for 23.1 percent, and veterinary services for 21.4 percent. Farm labor and management services; animal services, except veterinary; and soil preparation services make up the remaining 19.1 percent of the total receipts.

Lawn and garden services is the industry type with the largest proportion of gross receipts for agricultural services. It accounts for 54.2 percent of all receipts from landscape and horticultural services, and 19.7 percent of the U.S. total receipts from agricultural services. Veterinary services for dogs, cats, horses, bees, fish, rabbits, other fur-bearing animals, birds (except poultry), and other pets are second in gross receipts, accounting for 78.7 percent of the veterinary service industry group and

16.8 percent of the U.S. total receipts from agricultural services.

When distributed by gross receipts size classes, the largest concentration of establishments is in the "less than \$10,000" size class, totaling 26.9 percent of all establishments; the next largest is in the "\$10,000 to \$19,999" size class, totaling 18.5 percent. Establishments with gross receipts of \$100,000 or more, while representing only 17.6 percent of all establishments, account for 71.8 percent of all receipts. Chart 2 shows the percentage distribution of establishments and gross receipts for agricultural services by gross receipts size class.

LABOR AND ANNUAL PAYROLL

The annual payroll for agricultural services during 1978 totaled over \$2.55 billion. This amount covers over 332,000 paid employees working 150 days or more and nearly 662,000 paid employees working less than 150 days. The total number of unpaid workers includes about 43,000 persons working 150 days or more and approximately 29,000 persons working less than 150 days. Some of the persons working less than 150 days may have worked for more than one establishment during the year and, thus, may have been reported by two establishments or more. Therefore, the total number of persons engaged in agricultural service work for these establishments during 1978 is probably somewhat less than the total of 1,066,000.

The 10 leading States reported an annual payroll for agricultural services of \$1.69 billion accounting for 66.4 percent of the U.S. total. Their relative share of the U.S. agricultural service payroll is shown in table D.

The landscape and horticultural service group had the largest proportion, 37.1 percent, of payroll in the agricultural service industry. Veterinary services was second with 20 percent, and crop services was third with 19.5 percent. Farm labor and management services had 15.1 percent; animal services, except veterinary, had 7 percent; and soil preparation services had 1.2 percent.



Chart 2. Distribution of Establishments and Gross Receipts for Agricultural Services by Gross Receipts Size Class: 1978



Farm labor and management services had the largest proportion, 36.4 percent, of paid (full and part-time) employees. Landscape and horticultural services had the second largest proportion with 28.1 percent, followed by crop services with 20 percent. The combined total of veterinary services; animal services, except veterinary; and soil preparation services represent the remaining 15.5 percent of the U.S. total.

The distribution of payroll and paid employees for agricultural services by industry group is shown in chart 3.

TYPE OF ORGANIZATION

While individual proprietorships account for 74.7 percent of the total number of agricultural service establishments, they account for only 37.1 percent of the gross receipts and 27.4 percent of the annual payroll. On the other hand, corporations account for 50.5 percent of the gross receipts and 61.9 percent of the annual payroll, while representing only 16.3 percent of the total number of establishments.

Chart 4 presents a comparison of these organizations by number of agricultural service establishments, gross receipts, and

Chart 3. Distribution of Payroll and Paid Employees for Agricultural Services by Industry Group: 1978





Chart 4. Agricultural Service Establishments by Type of Organization: 1978

AGRICULTURAL SERVICE INDUSTRY GROUPS

The landscape and horticultural service group had the largest number of establishments totaling 46,584 (50 percent) of the U.S. total. This group also led in gross receipts with \$2.64 billion (36.4 percent) of the total gross receipts. In addition, landscape and horticultural services accounted for the largest

portion of annual payroll with \$947 million (37.1 percent) of the U.S. total.

Animal services, except veterinary, accounted for 16,890 establishments (18.1 percent) of the U.S. total. This group accounted for \$634 million (8.7 percent) of total gross receipts and \$178 million (7 percent) of annual payroll.

Veterinary services accounted for 15,551 establishments (16.7 percent) of the U.S. total. This group accounted for \$1.55 billion (21.4 percent) of total gross receipts and \$510 million (20 percent) of annual payroll.

Crop services ranked next in number of establishments representing 9,850 (10.6 percent) of the U.S. total, but ranked second in total gross receipts with \$1.68 billion (23.1 percent) and third in annual payroll with \$498 million (19.5 percent).

The farm labor and management services (SIC 076) and soil preparation service (SIC 071) industry groups accounted for the remaining 4,245 establishments (4.6 percent) of all establishments. These two groups had gross receipts of \$752 million (10.4 percent) and an annual payroll of \$417 million (16.3 percent) for the industry.

Chart 5 presents a comparison of the six industry groups by number of agricultural service establishments, gross receipts, and annual payroll.
