### Land in farms

Increased slightly from 236,073 acres in 1992 to 236,320 acres in 1997.

### Average size of farms

Increased 15 percent from 350 acres in 1992 to 404 acres in 1997.

### Full time farms

Decreased 15 percent from 410 farms in 1992 to 349 farms in 1997.

### Market value of agricultural products sold

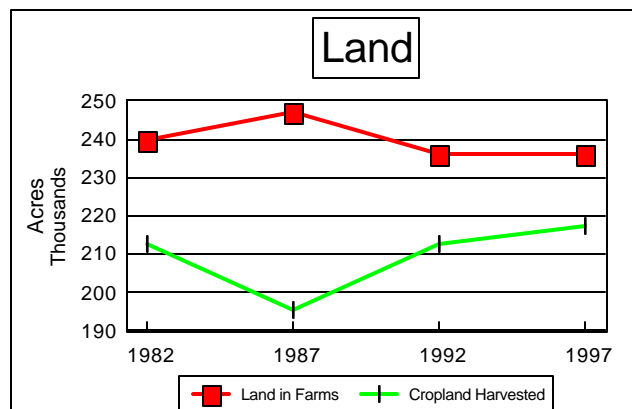
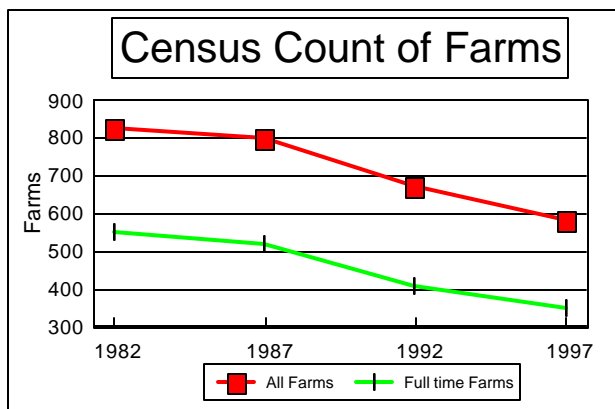
Increased 23 percent to \$106,004,000 in 1997.

Crop sales accounted for 60 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 40 percent of the market value.

### Market value of agricultural products sold, average per farm

Increased 42 percent from \$127,719 in 1992 to \$181,203 in 1997.
