Market value of agricultural products sold

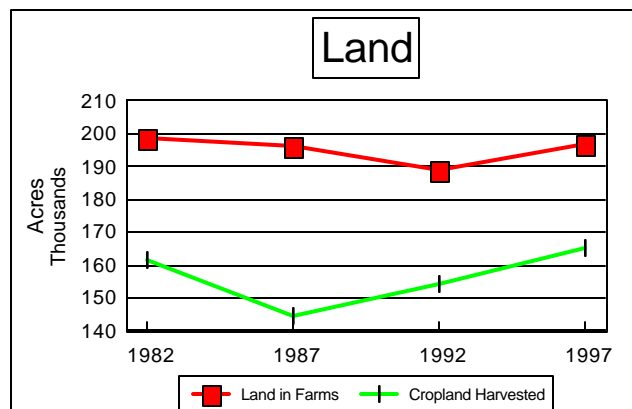
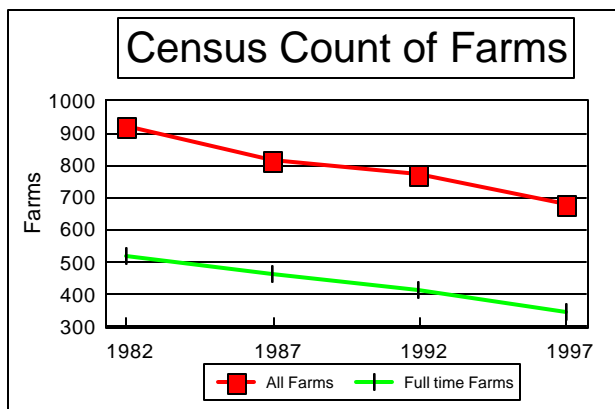
Increased 16 percent to \$74,763,000 in 1997.
