Market value of agricultural products sold

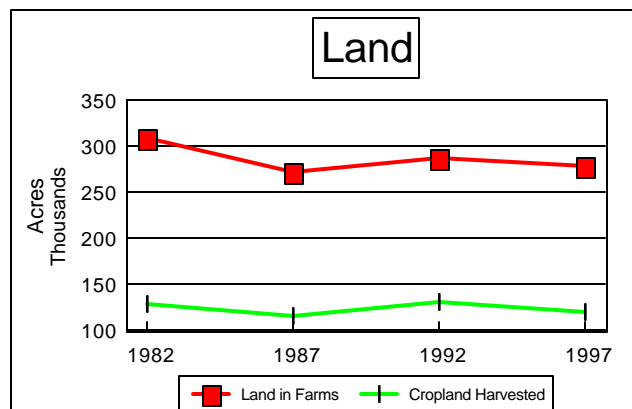
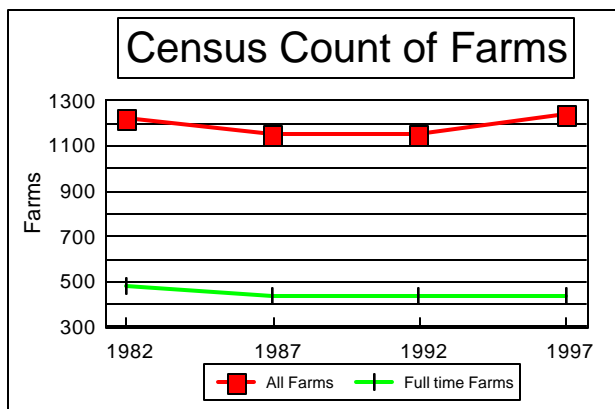
Increased 23 percent to \$39,902,000 in 1997.
