Market value of agricultural products sold

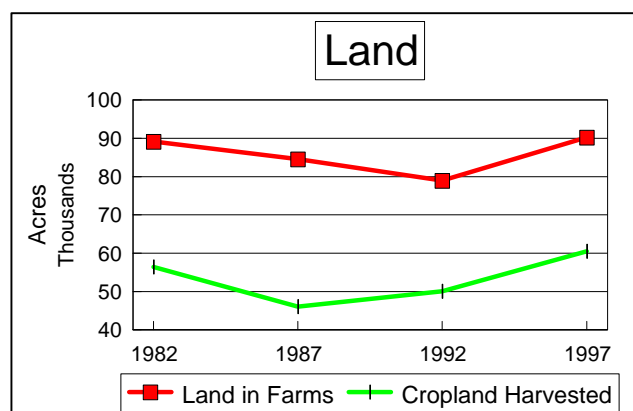
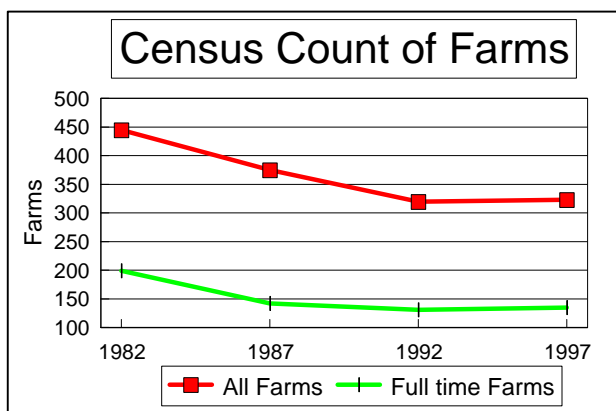
Increased 39 percent to \$24,949,000 in 1997.
