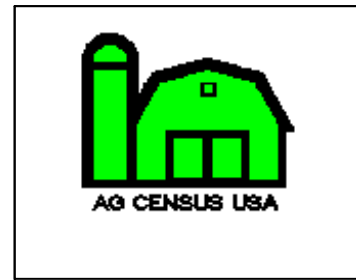


# 1997 Census of Agriculture State Profile

## NEW MEXICO

### Land in farms

Decreased 2 percent from 46,849,244 acres in 1992 to 45,787,108 acres in 1997.

### Average size of farms

Decreased slightly from 3,281 acres in 1992 to 3,249 acres in 1997.

### Full time farms

Decreased 5 percent from 7,540 farms in 1992 to 7,197 farms in 1997.

### Market value of agricultural products sold

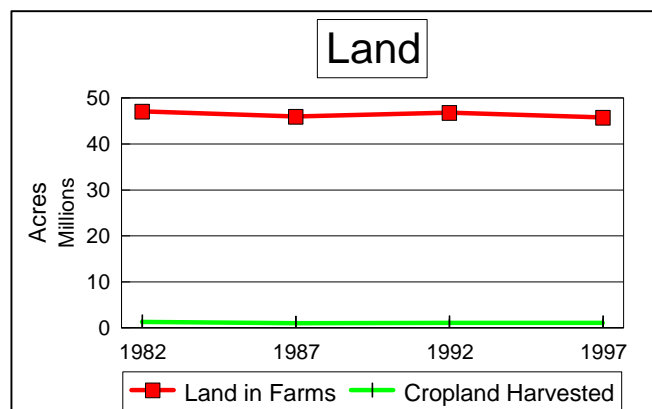
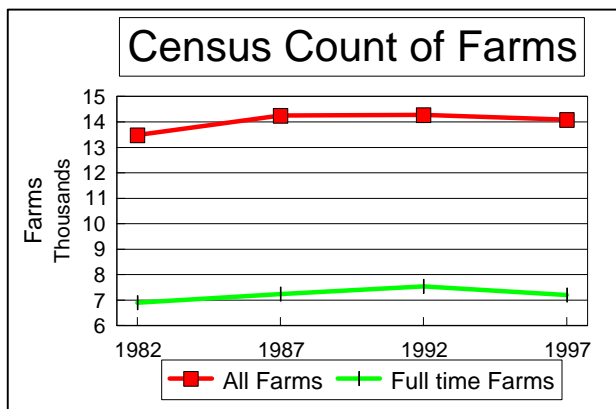
Increased 29 percent to \$1,617,708,000 in 1997.

Crop sales accounted for 29 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 71 percent of the market value.

### Market value of agricultural products sold, average per farm

Increased 30 percent from \$88,163 in 1992 to \$114,780 in 1997.
