Market value of agricultural products sold

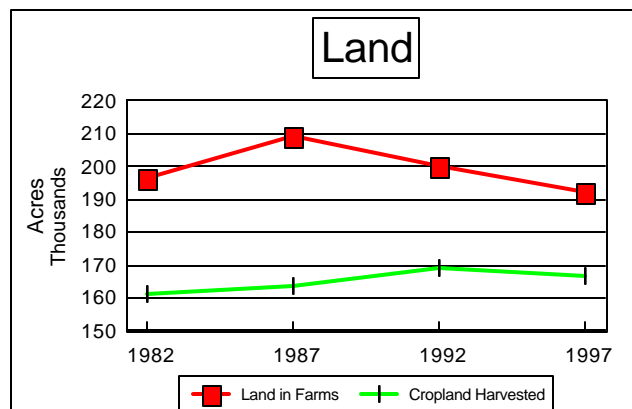
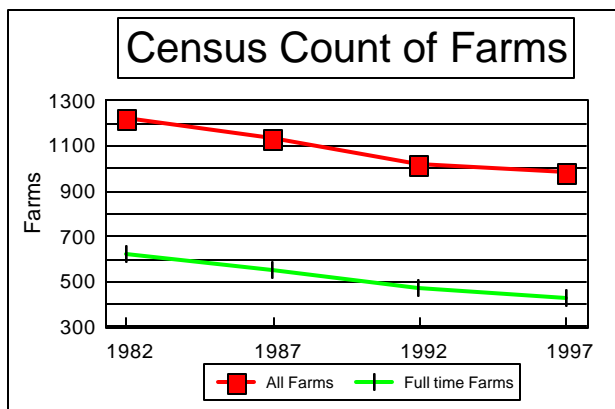
Increased 3 percent to \$64,097,000 in 1997.
