Market value of agricultural products sold

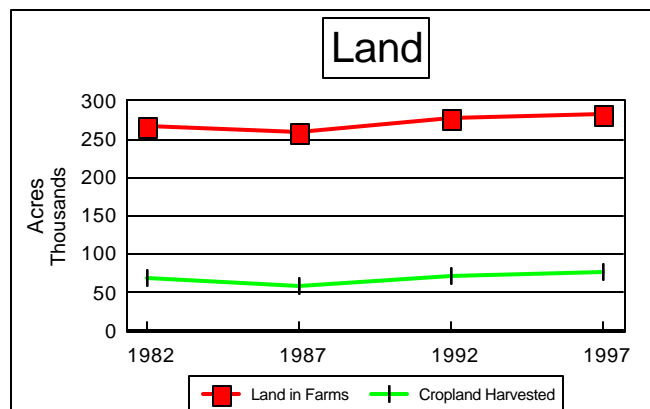
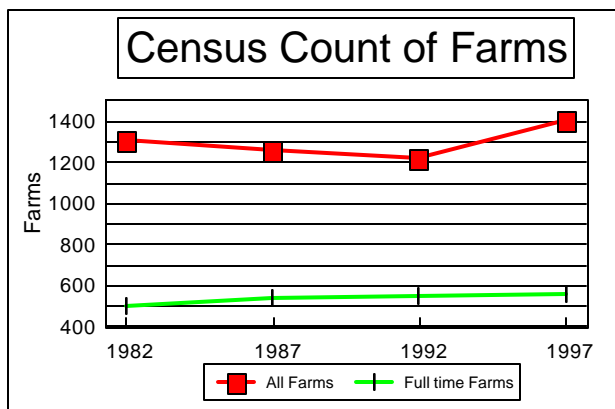
Increased 21 percent to \$33,422,000 in 1997.
