### Land in farms

Increased 4 percent from 125,092 acres in 1992 to 130,012 acres in 1997.

### Average size of farms

Decreased 8 percent from 203 acres in 1992 to 186 acres in 1997.

### Full time farms

Increased slightly from 208 farms in 1992 to 209 farms in 1997.

### Market value of agricultural products sold

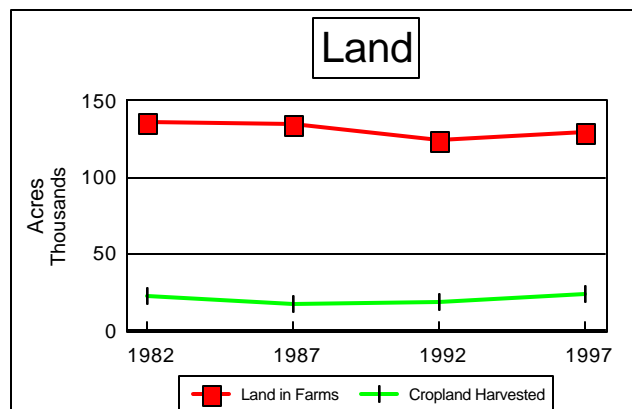
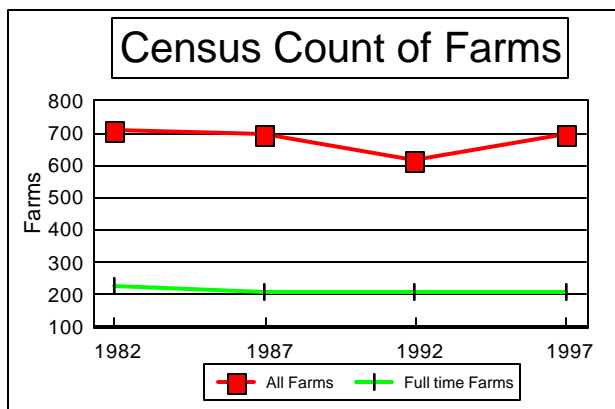
Increased 28 percent to \$8,207,000 in 1997.

Crop sales accounted for 26 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 74 percent of the market value.

### Market value of agricultural products sold, average per farm

Increased 13 percent from \$10,411 in 1992 to \$11,724 in 1997.
