### Land in farms

Decreased 2 percent from 525,885 acres in 1992 to 516,395 acres in 1997.

### Average size of farms

Decreased 11 percent from 382 acres in 1992 to 341 acres in 1997.

### Full time farms

Increased slightly from 614 farms in 1992 to 619 farms in 1997.

### Market value of agricultural products sold

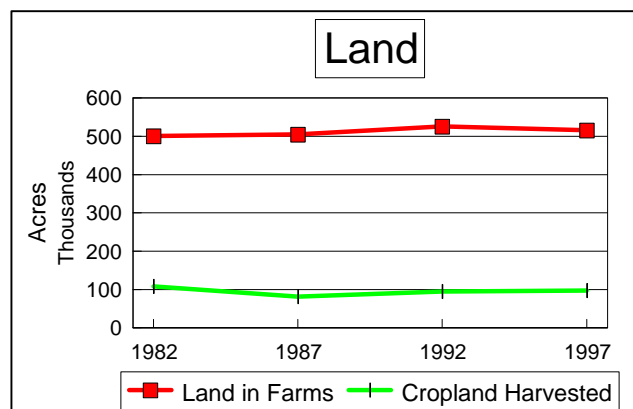
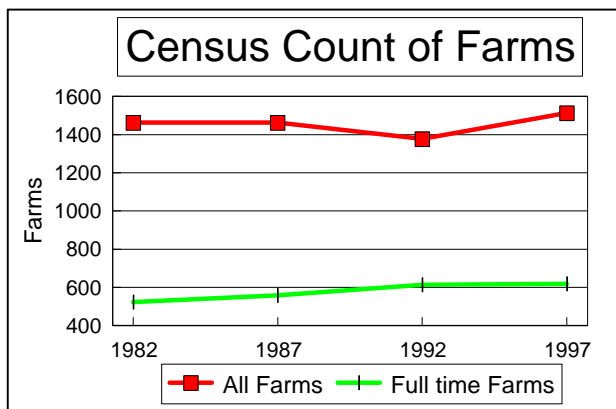
Increased 2 percent to \$33,574,000 in 1997.

Crop sales accounted for 37 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 63 percent of the market value.

### Market value of agricultural products sold, average per farm
