

## **UTAH**

Land in farms

Increased 25 percent from 9,624,463 acres in 1992 to 12,024,661 acres in 1997.

Average size of farms

Increased 19 percent from 712 acres in 1992 to 848 acres in 1997.

Full time farms

Decreased 4 percent from 6,269 farms in 1992 to 5,987 farms in 1997.

Market value of agricultural products sold


Increased 21 percent to \$877,295,000 in 1997.


Crop sales accounted for 28 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 72 percent of the market value.
