### Land in farms

Decreased 5 percent from 484,156 acres in 1992 to 457,823 acres in 1997.

### Average size of farms

Decreased 11 percent from 791 acres in 1992 to 704 acres in 1997.

### Full time farms

Decreased 7 percent from 375 farms in 1992 to 350 farms in 1997.

### Market value of agricultural products sold



Increased 19 percent to \$71,047,000 in 1997.

Crop sales accounted for 40 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 60 percent of the market value.

### Market value of agricultural products sold, average per farm

Increased 12 percent from \$97,218 in 1992 to \$109,302 in 1997.
