Decreased 44 percent from 105,576 acres in 1992 to 59,593 acres in 1997.

### Average size of farms

Decreased 44 percent from 559 acres in 1992 to 312 acres in 1997.

### Full time farms

Decreased slightly from 101 farms in 1992 to 100 farms in 1997.

### Market value of agricultural products sold

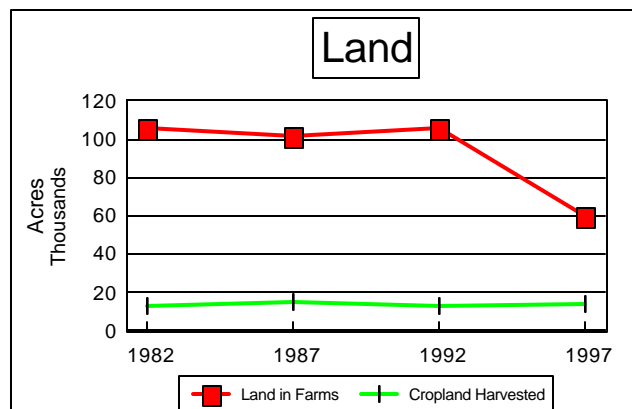
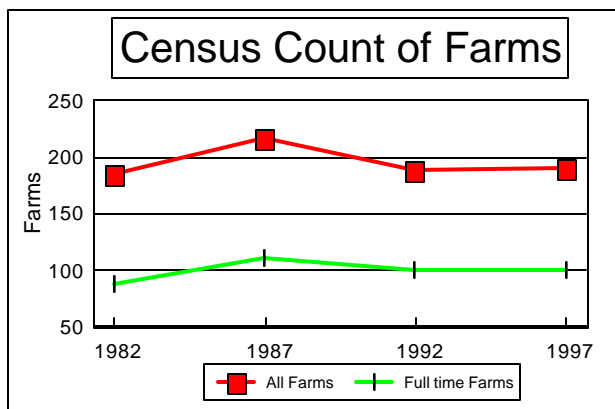
Increased 29 percent to \$11,200,000 in 1997.

Crop sales accounted for 9 percent of the market value.

Livestock sales accounted for 91 percent of the market value.

### Market value of agricultural products sold, average per farm

Increased 27 percent from \$46,102 in 1992 to \$58,637 in 1997.
