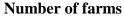

# Baldwin, Alabama






