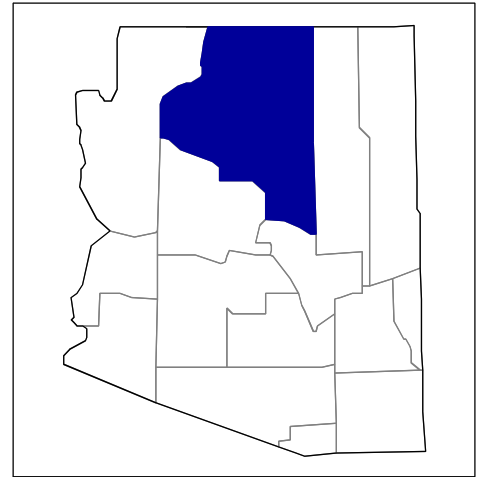


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

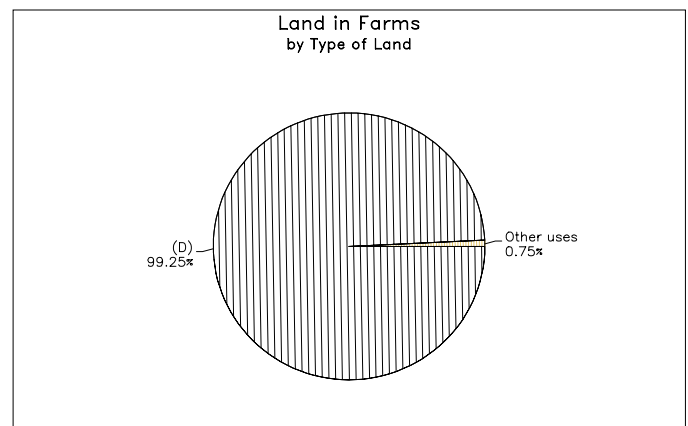
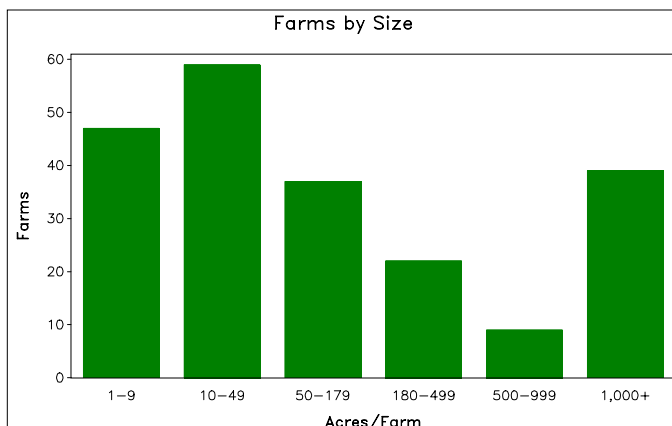
\$52,183 in 2002, \$38,801 in 1997, up 34 percent.
