

# Conway, Arkansas



#### **Number of farms**

779 farms in 2002, 799 farms in 1997, down 3 percent.

#### Land in farms

173,497 acres in 2002, 170,112 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

#### Average size of farm

223 acres in 2002, 213 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$100,514,000 in 2002, \$85,697,000 in 1997, up 17 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$6,564,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$93,951,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$129,030 in 2002, \$107,255 in 1997, up 20 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
