

#### **Number of farms**

393 farms in 2002, 403 farms in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### Land in farms

81,571 acres in 2002, 74,569 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

#### Average size of farm

208 acres in 2002, 185 acres in 1997, up 12 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$31,092,000 in 2002, \$34,766,000 in 1997, down 11 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$374,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$30,718,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$79,113 in 2002, \$86,269 in 1997, down 8 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
