

\$4,638,000 in 2002, \$6,043,000 in 1997, down 23 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$330,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,309,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$17,979 in 2002, \$26,620 in 1997, down 32 percent.


Government Payments
