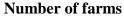


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

\$46,767,000 in 2002, \$23,159,000 in 1997, up 102 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$7,947,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$38,820,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm






