


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

## Brevard, Florida

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$42,159,000 in 2002, \$39,183,000 in 1997, up 8 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$35,306,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$6,853,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$75,961 in 2002, \$64,445 in 1997, up 18 percent.

#### **Government Payments**


\$52,000 in 2002, \$52,000 in 1997, unchanged.
