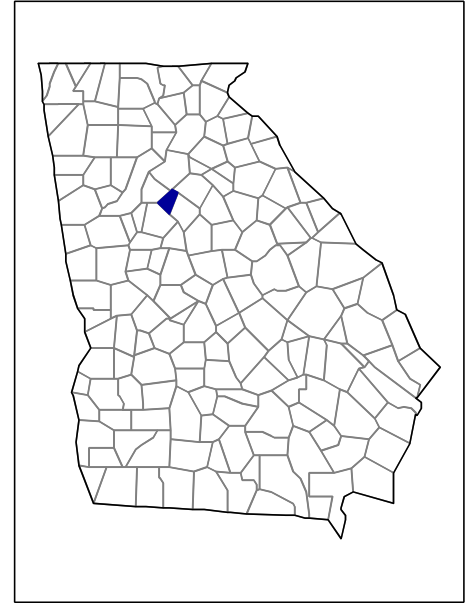


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

## Rockdale, Georgia

### Market Value of Production

\$852,000 in 2002, \$1,336,000 in 1997, down 36 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$385,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$467,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

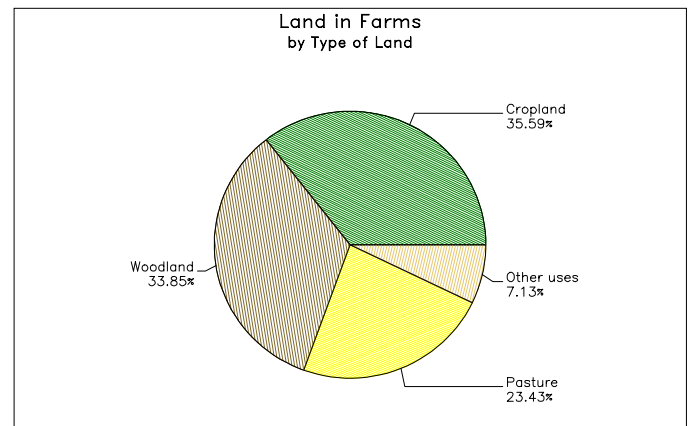
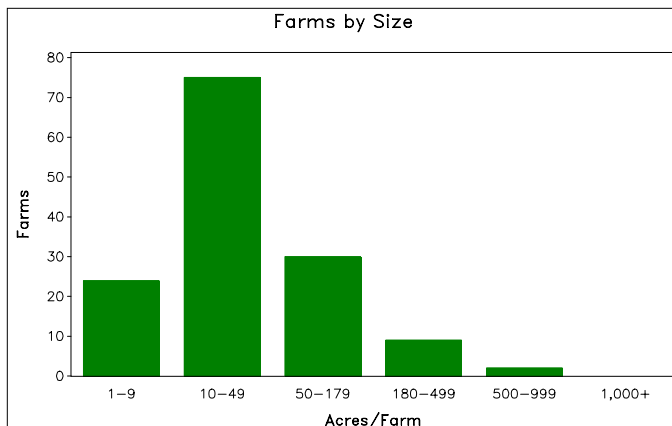
\$6,083 in 2002, \$9,147 in 1997, down 33 percent.
