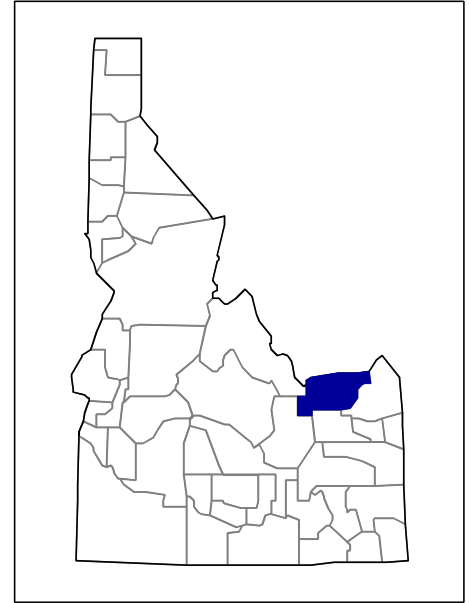


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

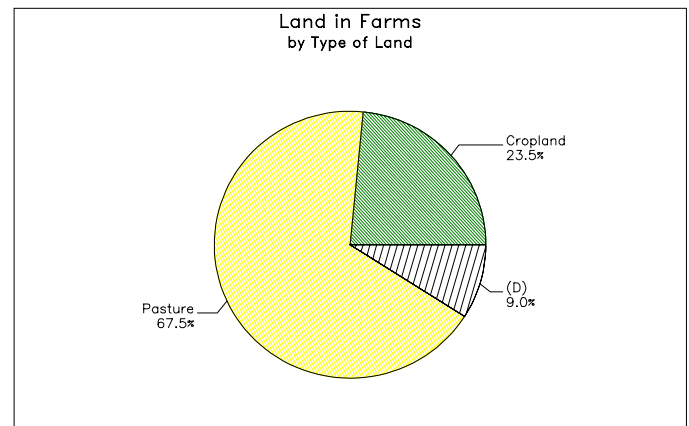
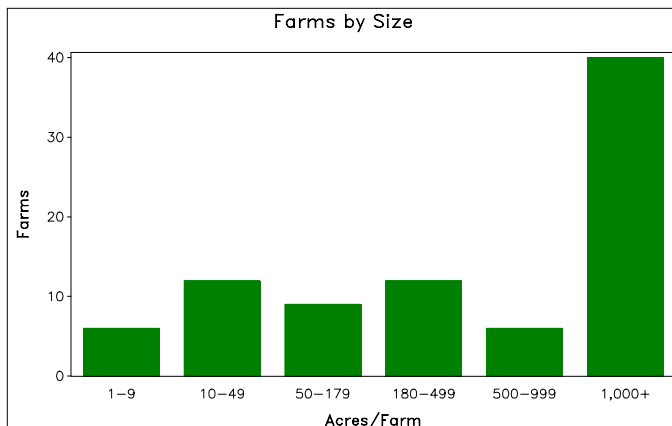
\$330,124 in 2002, \$384,931 in 1997, down 14 percent.
