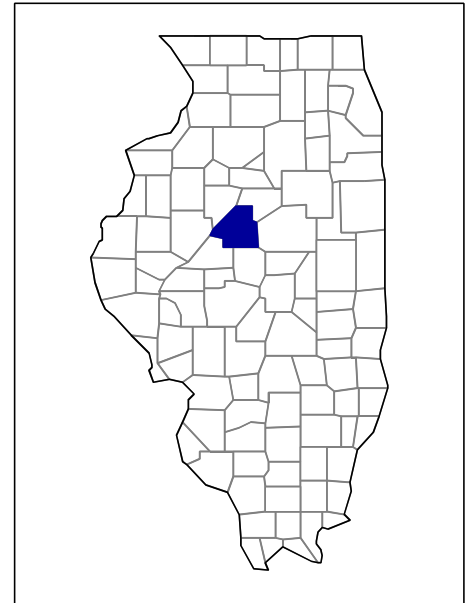


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

\$106,697,000 in 2002, \$123,848,000 in 1997, down 14 percent.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

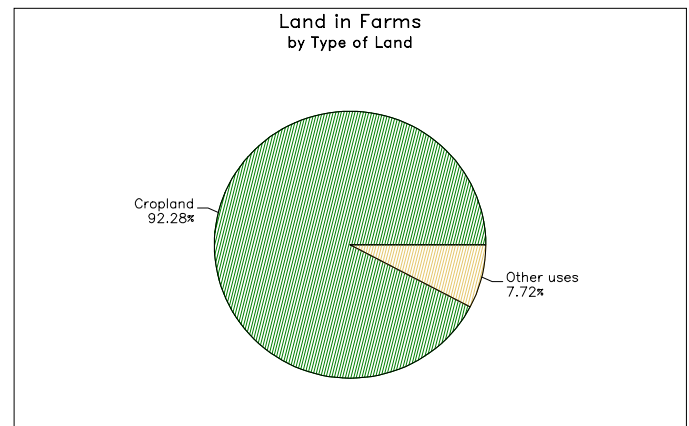
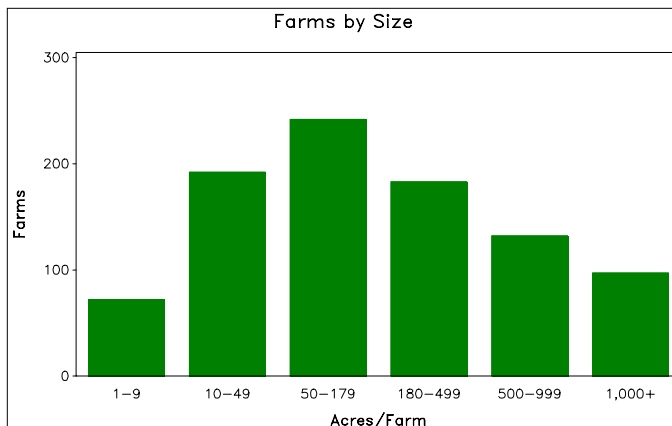
\$116,227 in 2002, \$127,810 in 1997, down 9 percent.
