

# Cedar, Iowa



#### Number of farms

338,493 acres in 2002, 337,077 acres in 1997, up slightly.

349 acres in 2002, 329 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$123,000,000 in 2002, \$130,902,000 in 1997, down 6 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$82,311,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$40,689,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$126,674 in 2002, \$127,959 in 1997, down 1 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
