

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$116,318,000 in 2002, \$115,805,000 in 1997, up slightly. Crop sales accounted for \$71,037,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$45,281,000 of the total value in 2002.

# Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$129,964 in 2002, \$127,538 in 1997, up 2 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
