

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$82,529,000 in 2002, \$83,963,000 in 1997, down 2 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$49,292,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$33,237,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$141,559 in 2002, \$136,303 in 1997, up 4 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
