

\$114,383,000 in 2002, \$129,897,000 in 1997, down 12 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$69,697,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$44,686,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$121,814 in 2002, \$122,429 in 1997, down 1 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
