


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$105,933,000 in 2002, \$123,544,000 in 1997, down 14 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$75,622,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$30,311,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$128,093 in 2002, \$134,287 in 1997, down 5 percent.


## **Government Payments**
