

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$225,747,000 in 2002, \$179,262,000 in 1997, up 26 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$87,751,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$137,996,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$300,196 in 2002, \$236,182 in 1997, up 27 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
