

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$54,420,000 in 2002, \$53,385,000 in 1997, up 2 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$19,780,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$34,641,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$123,402 in 2002, \$132,140 in 1997, down 7 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
