

Market Value of Production

\$2,504,000 in 2002, \$3,915,000 in 1997, down 36 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,967,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$537,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$6,749 in 2002, \$9,434 in 1997, down 28 percent.


Government Payments
