

# **Breathitt, Kentucky**

#### **Number of farms**

209 farms in 2002, 211 farms in 1997, down 1 percent.

#### Land in farms

51,179 acres in 2002, 48,362 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### Average size of farm

245 acres in 2002, 229 acres in 1997, up 7 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$1,343,000 in 2002, \$1,455,000 in 1997, down 8 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$967,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$376,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$6,425 in 2002, \$6,895 in 1997, down 7 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
