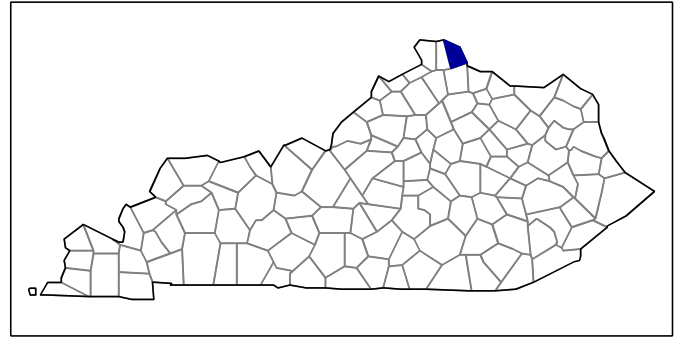




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



## Campbell, Kentucky

### Number of farms

581 farms in 2002, 584 farms in 1997, down 1 percent.

### Land in farms

50,383 acres in 2002, 50,294 acres in 1997, up slightly.

### Average size of farm

87 acres in 2002, 86 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$5,853,000 in 2002, \$5,769,000 in 1997, up 1 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$2,998,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$2,855,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

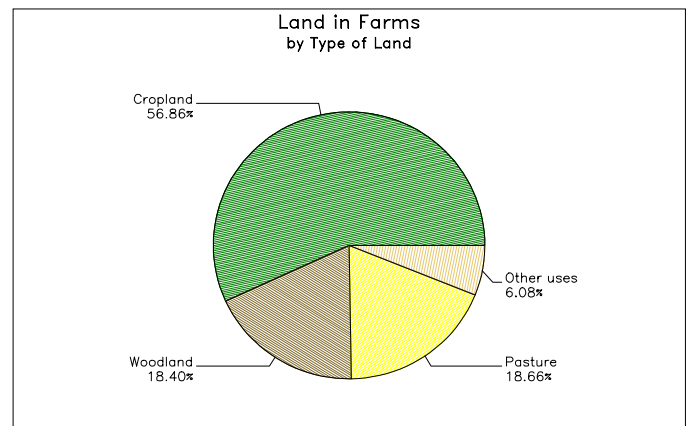
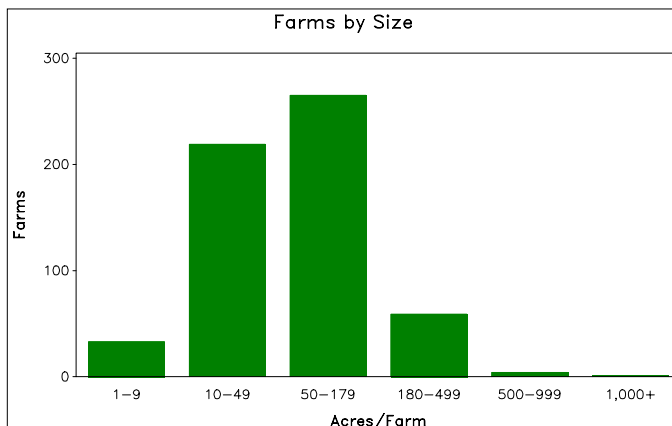
\$10,074 in 2002, \$9,878 in 1997, up 2 percent.
