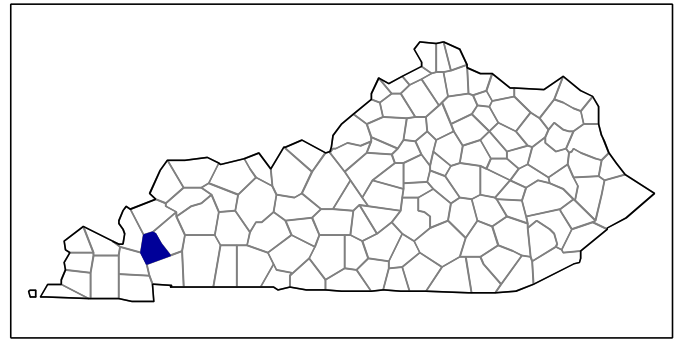




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



## Lyon, Kentucky

### Number of farms

304 farms in 2002, 282 farms in 1997, up 8 percent.

### Land in farms

56,411 acres in 2002, 51,579 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

### Average size of farm

186 acres in 2002, 183 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$4,704,000 in 2002, \$6,229,000 in 1997, down 24 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$2,967,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$1,737,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

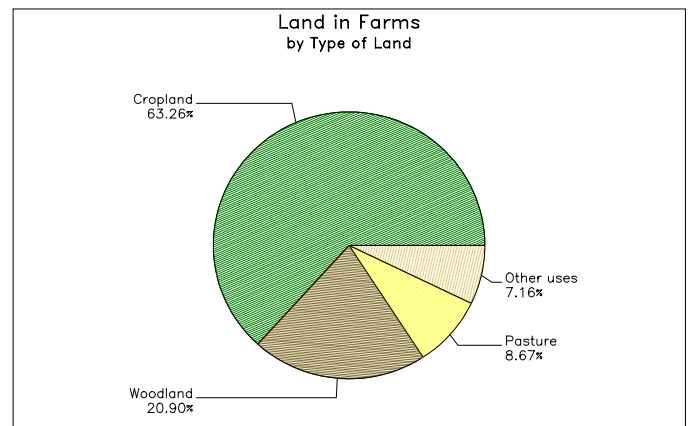
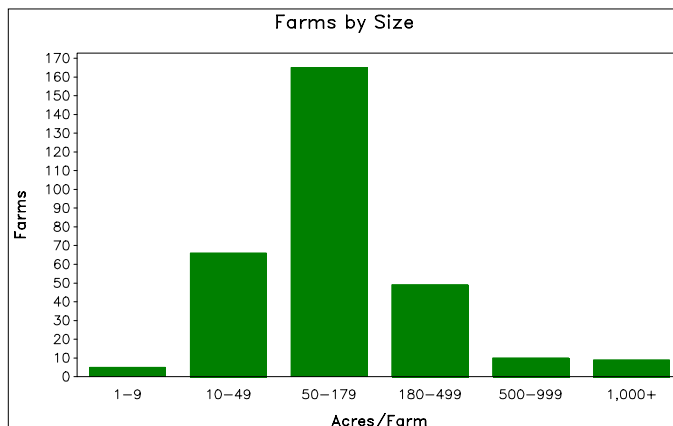
\$15,475 in 2002, \$22,087 in 1997, down 30 percent.
