


# 2002 Census of Agriculture Parish Profile

# Jefferson Davis, Louisiana



#### **Number of farms**

641 farms in 2002, 697 farms in 1997, down 8 percent.

#### Land in farms

323,238 acres in 2002, 307,397 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

# Average size of farm

504 acres in 2002, 441 acres in 1997, up 14 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$32,316,000 in 2002, \$52,900,000 in 1997, down 39 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$27,999,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,317,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$50,416 in 2002, \$75,897 in 1997, down 34 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
