

\$45,162,000 in 2002, \$65,338,000 in 1997, down 31 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$44,577,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$585,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$164,826 in 2002, \$200,425 in 1997, down 18 percent.


Government Payments
