

68,630 acres in 2002, 67,983 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

171 acres in 2002, 136 acres in 1997, up 26 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$21,725,000 in 2002, \$21,420,000 in 1997, up 1 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$9,707,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$12,018,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$54,178 in 2002, \$42,755 in 1997, up 27 percent.


Government Payments
