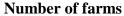


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm






\$15,538,000 in 2002, \$14,521,000 in 1997, up 7 percent.
