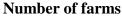

# Morrison, Minnesota






\$4,627,000 in 2002, \$2,896,000 in 1997, up 60 percent.
