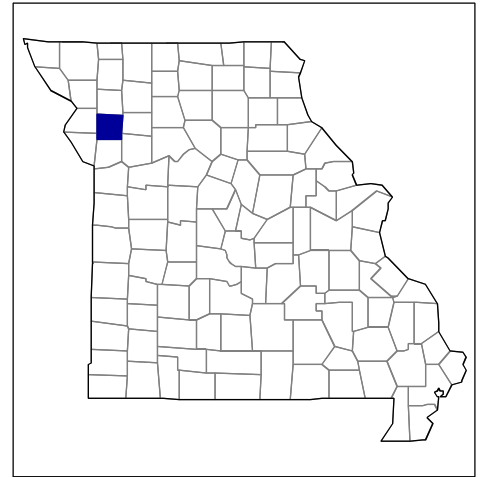




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

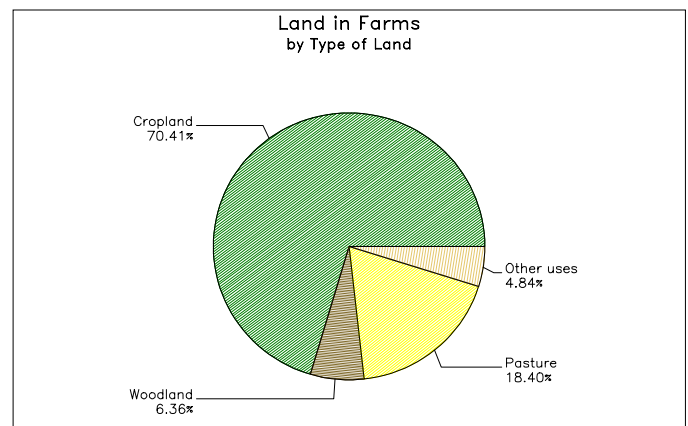
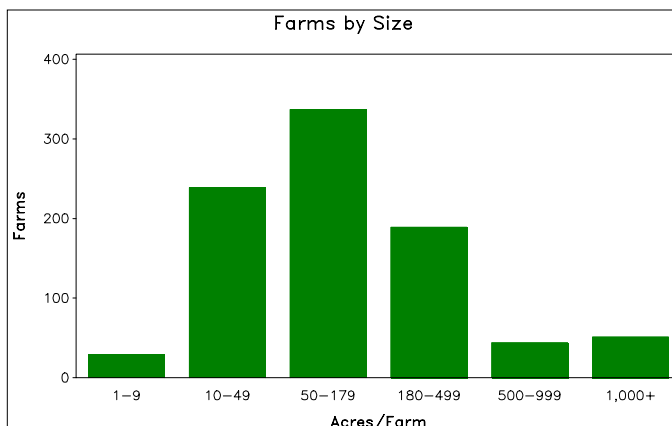
\$35,321 in 2002, \$39,813 in 1997, down 11 percent.
